The heroic struggle now being waged by the people of Panama against U.S. aggression and in defence of their national sovereignty is a great and patriotic struggle. The Chinese people stand firmly on the side of the Panamanian people and fully support their just action in opposing the U.S. aggressors and seeking to regain sovereignty over the Panama Canal Zone.

U.S. imperialism is the most ferocious enemy of the people of the world.

It has not only committed the grave crime of aggression against the Panamanian people and earnestly and stubbornly plotted to strangle

socialist Cuba, but has also never ceased to plunder and trample on the people of the Latin American countries and suppress their national-democratic revolutionary struggles.

In Asia, U.S. imperialism has forcibly occupied China's Taiwan, converted the southern parts of Korea and of Viet Nam into its colonies, kept Japan under its control and semi-military occupation, undermined the peace, neutrality and independence of Laos, plotted to subvert the Royal Government of Cambodia, and perpetrated intervention and aggression against other Asian countries. More recently, it has decided to send a U.S. fleet into the Indian Ocean, menacing the security of the Southeast Asian countries.

In Africa, U.S. imperialism is feverishly pursuing its neo-colonialist policies, actively seeking to replace the old colonialists, plunder and enslave the peoples of Africa, and undermine and stamp out their national-liberation movements.

The aggressive and bellicose policies of U.S. imperialism also seriously threaten the Soviet Union, China and the other socialist countries. Moreover, it is energetically striving to push its policy of "peaceful evolution" in the socialist countries, in order to restore capitalism in and disintegrate the socialist camp.

U.S. imperialism is even pursuing a "jungle law" policy towards its own allies in Western Europe, North America and Oceania, trying hard to trample them underfoot.

The aggressive plans of U.S. imperialism to dominate the whole world run in a continuous line from Truman, through Eisenhower and Kennedy, to Johnson.

The people of the countries in the socialist camp should unite, the people of the countries in Asia, Africa and Latin America should unite, the people of the continents of the world should unite, all peace-loving countries and all countries that are subject to U.S. aggression, control, interference and bullying should unite, and should form the broadest united front to oppose the U.S. imperialist policies of aggression and war and to safeguard world peace.

Riding roughshod everywhere, U.S. imperialism has made itself the enemy of the people the world over and has increasingly isolated itself. The atom bombs and hydrogen bombs in the hands of the U.S. imperialists can never cow anyone who refuses to be enslaved. The struggle of the people of the world against U.S. imperialism and its lackeys will assuredly win still greater victories.

## THE PEOPLE OF PANAMA CANNOT BE BULLIED

(*Renmin Ribao* Editorial, January 12, 1964)

The U.S. imperialists have carried out cold-blooded acts of massacre against the people of Panama. The heroic Panamanian people are now struggling courageously against U.S. aggression and to safeguard their national sovereignty. The Chinese people firmly protest against U.S. imperialism's barbarous massacre of the people of Panama and express their resolute support for the Panamanians' just, patriotic struggle.

In defiance of Panama's sovereign rights and in violation of the U.S.-Panamanian agreement, the U.S. occupation authorities hoist only their own national flag in the Panama Canal Zone. When the patriotic Panamanians rose in protest, they called out a large number of troops to suppress the demonstrators in cold blood. As a result, more than three hundred Panamanians were killed or injured by the bullets of the U.S. imperialists. This monstrous atrocity perpetrated by the U.S. imperialists has aroused strong indignation among the people of Panama. Vigorous anti-U.S. demonstrations have been launched on a large scale in the Panama Canal Zone and in other parts of Panama. The Panamanian government has announced its suspension of relations with the United States and demanded the restoration of its sovereignty

over the canal zone. The flames of wrath of the Panamanian people against U.S. imperialism have been ignited by the sanguinary violence of U.S. imperialism itself. This is Latin America's first clap of thunder for this spring.

More than half a century ago, the U.S. imperialists occupied the Panama Canal Zone, making use of an unequal treaty forced on Panama. This has seriously impaired the territorial integrity and national sovereignty of Panama; moreover, it has created "a state within a state" to be used as a base for aggression and control over all Panama. The Panamanian people have for years been struggling to recover the canal zone. The U.S. government, shaken by their wrath, was forced to reach an accord with the government of Panama last year, agreeing that the flags of both Panama and the United States should be flown in the canal zone. This step was only a stratagem to soothe the anti-U.S. feelings of the Panamanian people. It was certainly not genuine recognition of Panama's sovereignty over the canal zone. So the fact that the U.S. authorities this time flew only their own national flag was certainly no accident. And the outright armed suppression of the demonstrations of patriotic Panamanian masses by the U.S. ruling group was a naked exposure of the fact that U.S. imperialism regards not only the canal zone but all Panama as its colony and considers that it can do anything it likes to the people of Panama.

This blood-thirsty violence against the people of Panama again reveals the vicious features of U.S. imperialism, which is bent on aggression. U.S. imperialism not only does its utmost to maintain its colonial rule in Latin America but also tries to tyrannize over the whole

world. Everywhere, it throws its weight about, plays the overlord, encroaches on the sovereignty of other countries and interferes in their internal affairs. It makes no exceptions even of its allies like Britain, France and Japan. Recently, the U.S. ruling group has become still more outrageous. Washington officials declare in public that U.S. interests are global interests and that they must maintain "a role of world leadership". U.S. imperialism stops at nothing in carrying out its aggressive plans to subjugate the peoples; it does all manner of evil and thus inevitably forces more and more countries and people to rise and strike back. Now the people of Panama have shaken the heavens with their cry of wrath and greater storms will rise against U.S. imperialism.

Only the day before the U.S. army of aggression began to use its murderous weapons in the Panama Canal Zone, U.S. President Lyndon Johnson was sermonizing in the Congress about how the United States must become a better neighbour to the Latin American countries. Johnson talks all manner of good but does all manner of evil. And in this he is not a bit behind his predecessor, Kennedy. His State of the Union Message to Congress on January 8 showed that he has inherited the Kennedy mantle in its entirety and has made up his mind to continue the Kennedy dual tactics of counter-revolution, to attain the objective of U.S. global strategy to dominate the world. Johnson makes a big noise about a world without war. But does not the U.S. action in Panama give a clear picture of the method by which the U.S. ruling circles want to set up this world of their dreams? How strange, then, that some who call themselves Marxist-Leninists actually applaud Johnson's State of the Union Message.

The Panamanian people are carrying on an entirely just struggle. All the people of the world who love peace and uphold justice are on their side. We are convinced that so long as the people of Panama strengthen their unity and persevere in the struggle, they will certainly recover their lost territory, haul down the flag of the United States and raise the flag of Panama over the Panama Canal.

The Panama Canal belongs to the Panamanian people!  
U.S. imperialism, get off Panamanian soil!

VICTORY BELONGS TO THE PANAMANIAN PEOPLE  
WHO PERSIST IN THEIR STRUGGLE

The heroic Panamanian people have once again launched powerful demonstrations against U.S. imperialist aggression, shouting "We won't retreat a single step!" and resolutely demanding the recovery of their sovereignty over the Panama Canal Zone. This constitutes another strong rebuff to U.S. imperialism, which has insisted on occupying this canal zone in defiance of the Panamanian people's just demand.

As a result of the resolute demand and with the staunch support of the people throughout the country, the Panamanian government, following the severance of diplomatic relations with the United States, has taken a further step by demanding the departure of the U.S. embassy personnel within a specified time. The Panamanian President, Roberto Chiari, has made it clear that Panama will never cede sovereignty and will insist on the signing of a new canal treaty.

At a special congress held on January 18 the representatives of all municipal councils of Panama supported the just stand of their government and unanimously adopted a resolution demanding the abrogation of the Panama-U.S. treaty concerning the canal zone. This

testifies to the firm resolve of the Panamanian people to unite as one and to carry on the struggle until victory.

In defiance of tyranny, the Panamanian people are firmly united in their unflinching struggle to safeguard their sovereignty and national dignity and to recover the canal zone. The Chinese people express boundless admiration for the Panamanian people's fearless spirit. Strong waves of support for the just, patriotic struggle of the Panamanians are sweeping the length and breadth of China. The 650 million Chinese people pledge themselves to stand squarely behind the Panamanians.

Following their monstrous acts of massacre against the Panamanian people, the U.S. imperialists, in defiance of universal condemnation, have been bringing more military threats and political pressure to bear on Panama, and heaping insults on the national dignity of that country. The U.S. government has claimed that the United States "has the responsibility for defending" the canal zone, praised the U.S. occupation troops which killed Panamanians for having carried out their duty "very effectively", and sent Army Secretary C. Vance to prepare to step up armed suppression in the canal zone.

While pretending to seek a "peaceful settlement", the U.S. government has resorted to all kinds of shameless methods. Completely ignoring the Panamanian government's decision to sever relations with the United States, the U.S. government has directed its instrument, the Organization of American States, to "mediate" with the aim of compelling Panama to accept the agreement for the resumption of diplomatic relations, thereby undermining the Panamanian people's just, patriotic struggle for the recovery of their state sovereignty. Hardly had the ink on the agreement on resumption of diplomatic relations

dried when U.S. officials announced that no formal talks on the U.S.-Panama treaty would be held with Panama, that the United States was only ready to hear Panama's "appeal", to recognize Panama's "titular sovereignty" and give her a few more coppers.

The despotic behaviour of the U.S. imperialists in disregarding Panama's sacred sovereignty and national dignity can never be tolerated by any self-respecting country or people. As President Chiari has said, the U.S. government does not regard Panama as a mature nation and attacks its honour at will. In such circumstances, "how can we react otherwise and more worthily than by refusing to maintain relations with a government which harms our national honour?"

In short, U.S. imperialism does not give a pin for the Panamanian people. It bullies and humbugs them at will and stubbornly holds on to its privileges in the Panama Canal Zone. The U.S. White House in a communique on January 14 declared arrogantly that "we have a recognized obligation to operate the canal efficiently and securely". The U.S. propaganda machine has clamoured brazenly that the United States must retain its occupation of the Panama Canal. It is clear that the U.S. imperialists' talk about willingness to seek a "peaceful" settlement is sheer deception, and the Panamanian people have seen through it. They entertain no illusions whatsoever towards U.S. imperialism and are determined to struggle against U.S. imperialist aggression and in defence of their state sovereignty until the unequal treaty imposed upon them by the United States is abolished. The Panamanian people have done well and they are in the right.

The ferocious countenance of U.S. imperialism in Panama has once again taught all Latin American countries that U.S. imperialism will never abandon its colonial interests in Latin America, nor will it ever treat the Latin American countries as equals. It is pure illusion for anyone to think that U.S. imperialism will give up its vested interests in Latin America in accordance with the desire of the Latin American countries and through a "peaceful" settlement. Therefore, the only way to get rid of U.S. imperialist oppression and plunder is for the Latin American countries to unite together to oppose U.S. imperialism and support one another in their common struggle. The immediate urgent task is to resolutely support to the end the Panamanian people's struggle against U.S. imperialism for the restoration of their sovereignty over the Panama Canal Zone.

The Panamanian people's just demand will surely be realized. So long as they strengthen their unity, sharpen their vigilance, and persist in the struggle, the Panamanian people, with the support of other Latin American people and the people throughout the world, will surely drive out the U.S. aggressors from their territory and recover the Panama Canal Zone which has been occupied by U.S. imperialism for more than half a century. The final victory belongs to the heroic Panamanian people who are persisting in their struggle.

ALL THE WORLD'S FORCES OPPOSING  
U.S. IMPERIALISM, UNITE!

In his statement to a *Renmin Ribao* correspondent on January 12, Comrade Mao Tse-tung declared the Chinese people's firm support for the patriotic and just struggle of the Panamanian people against U.S. imperialist aggression and called on the people of the world and all countries subject to U.S. aggression, control, interference and bullying to unite and form the broadest united front to oppose the U.S. imperialist policies of aggression and war and to safeguard world peace. His statement has received wide response from world public opinion.

The U.S. imperialists are the most ferocious and most arrogant aggressors in the history of mankind. After the end of World War II, relying on their economic and military strength which had been greatly inflated in the war and in particular their atomic monopoly, they feverishly pursued a plan to dominate and enslave the world. Harry S. Truman, the then President of the United States, declared: "The victory which we have won has placed upon the American people the continuing burden of responsibility for world leadership." To fulfil this "responsibility", U.S. imperialism has, behind the anti-Soviet and anti-communist smokescreen, built

military bases, organized military blocs, carried out subversive activities, and suppressed national-liberation movements and popular revolutionary struggles everywhere, in an all-out attempt to seize, first of all, the vast intermediate zone lying between the United States and the socialist countries. At the same time, it threatens the socialist countries with war and makes military provocations against them, fondly hoping that some day it will be able to liquidate the socialist camp and bring the whole world under its domination.

The U.S. imperialist venture to dominate the world reached its climax in the first postwar decade. During this period, the U.S. ruling circles pursued their most frantic policies of war and plans of aggression, such as the policies of "emancipation", "massive retaliation" and "brinkmanship", "limited wars", the "Marshall plan", the "Truman doctrine", the "mutual security program" and so on. U.S. imperialism acted like a swash-buckling lord of the world, trying to ride roughshod over all. However, in its trial of strength with the peoples of the world and the socialist countries in that decade, U.S. imperialism already began to show its essential nature as apparently strong but actually weak. The biggest trials of strength took place in China and Korea, and U.S. imperialism was the loser. It also failed in its intervention in Indo-China and in inciting the counter-revolutionary riot in Hungary. The late John Foster Dulles who became U.S. Secretary of State in 1953 was regarded as the most high-handed of all U.S. Secretaries of State. But in fact he had the most difficult time of all the U.S. Secretaries of State in the first postwar decade. Like a spent bullet, U.S. imperialism had already begun to go downhill. By 1957 the international situation had reached a new turning-point,

with the East wind prevailing over the West wind. In the face of this development, the well-known U.S. bourgeois columnist, Walter Lippmann, wrote in 1958: "The period of American supremacy was, as we can now see, a passing phase in human affairs, and our failure to learn to live with this great fact of life, the persistence of delusion among us of our own supremacy, is almost certainly the root of our miscalculations in foreign policy." William C. Bullitt, a former U.S. diplomat, too, deplored: "Since the Second World War our foreign policy has led us from a pinnacle of power and security into the valley of the shadow of death." Their comments reflected the sad helplessness of the ruling circles in the United States in the face of the overwhelming force of circumstances.

Following his rise to power, the late John F. Kennedy, in his fond hope of turning back the course of events, alleged that the current of history had changed. In fact, the international situation continued to develop in a way that was favourable to the peoples but unfavourable to U.S. imperialism. Instead of going on the decline, the revolutionary movement of the peoples of the world has made big headway; instead of heading downhill, their anti-U.S. struggle has gained momentum. Even Panama, which the U.S. imperialists have arrogantly claimed to have "founded", can no longer tolerate their oppression and slavery. At no time has U.S. imperialist domination been so unstable and shaky, and at no time have the U.S. imperialists found themselves in such a state of isolation and in the throes of such an acute crisis.

This increasing U.S. isolation and passivity is the inevitable outcome of its global strategy of world conquest.

This policy of world domination first of all arouses the resistance of the oppressed nations and people in

Asia, Africa and Latin America. U.S. imperialism seeks vigorously to maintain its colonial domination in Latin America and to stem the tide of the national-democratic movement in this area. But the Latin American people who have long groaned under its heels can no longer resign themselves to slavery. The victory of the Cuban people's revolution has made a breach in the "backyard" of the United States and greatly encouraged the revolutionary struggle of the other Latin American peoples. As a result, the anti-U.S. current is sweeping ever more furiously over the whole of the continent. In Asia the United States fosters the most reactionary forces everywhere, sets up puppet regimes, suppresses the revolutionary movements of the peoples, engages in aggression, and enslaves the peoples of various countries. This has brought about an anti-U.S.-imperialist storm in the vast area stretching from Japan, south Korea, south Viet Nam, Laos, Cambodia, Indonesia, Burma and Pakistan to the West Asian countries. U.S. imperialism seeks vigorously to force its way into Africa and replace the old colonialists, but the African people are daily awakening and recognize more and more clearly the ferocious features of the U.S. neo-colonialists. The spearhead of the African people's struggle will inevitably be directed mainly against U.S. imperialism, the common enemy of the people of the whole world. So in Asia, Africa and Latin America, anti-U.S.-imperialist flames are raging and spreading.

U.S. imperialist policy of world domination also inevitably meets resistance from other major capitalist countries. Banking on its superior position in the capitalist world in the early postwar years, the United States endeavoured not only to enslave the vanquished nations, but

also to control its wartime allies. It treated the latter as its subordinates, ordering them about as it fancied. Under U.S. oppression and bullying, these countries had to swallow insults in meek submission. However, the happy days for the United States were soon over. The operation of the law of the uneven development of capitalism has led to a change in the balance of forces inside the imperialist camp. The West European countries and Japan have revived and built up their strength. They are all eager to break away from U.S. political and military control and to embark on the road of independent development. In recent years the imperialist camp has been heading rapidly towards disintegration. The struggle waged by the "allies" of the United States against its control has daily become fiercer. British Prime Minister Douglas-Home said recently that Britain could not be content with being "a secondary power". Speaking of Franco-American relations, French President Charles de Gaulle said: "We intend not to be its satellite . . . we want to be independent, we want to be French." West German Chancellor Ludwig Erhard declared: "We are not an American protectorate." The Japanese ruling class, as the U.S. press put it, has also contracted the "de Gaulle fever". The U.S. position as leader of its allies has been shaken to its very foundations.

It can thus be seen that the U.S. imperialist attempt to seize the intermediate zone is bound to run up against the opposition of all the peoples and countries in that region. This vast intermediate zone is composed of two parts. One part consists of the independent countries and those striving for independence in Asia, Africa and Latin America; it may be called the first intermediate zone. The second part consists of the whole of Western Europe,

Oceania, and Canada and other capitalist countries; it may be called the second intermediate zone. Countries in this second intermediate zone have a dual character. While their ruling classes are exploiters and oppressors, these countries themselves are subjected to U.S. control, interference and bullying. They therefore try their best to free themselves from U.S. control. In this regard, they have something in common with the socialist countries and the peoples of various countries. By making itself antagonistic to the whole world, U.S. imperialism inevitably finds itself tightly encircled.

Of course, U.S. imperialism is still a strong imperialist power with fairly massive economic and military strength. It produces up to a hundred million tons of steel a year and has stockpiles of atomic and hydrogen bombs, and a world-wide network of military bases. Pitting itself against the people everywhere in an attempt to dominate the world, U.S. imperialism has made enemies throughout the world. It has stretched itself over an inordinately wide front, and, like one who tries to catch ten fleas at the same time, it is unable to get one without missing the others. Actually, U.S. imperialism is strong only in appearance; in reality, it is very brittle and extremely weak. Wherever the monstrous claws of the United States extend, there the storm of anti-U.S. struggle breaks out, and an "earthquake" occurs. The military bases set up by the United States throughout the world have become nooses round its own neck. No matter how U.S. imperialism goes on stockpiling atomic and hydrogen bombs, this will not alter one whit its inherent weakness. In a word, the ambition of U.S. imperialism far exceeds its power. There is no way to overcome this fatal weakness of U.S. imperialism.

U.S. imperialism, however, never retreats before the impossible; the greater difficulties it meets, the more desperately it struggles. The successive U.S. administrations from Truman, through Eisenhower and Kennedy, to Johnson, have consistently executed the policies of aggression and war worked out by the U.S. monopoly groups, in an attempt to realize their rabid ambition of world conquest. U.S. imperialism is now redoubling its efforts to undermine and liquidate the socialist camp by means of its dual tactics of war and peace. It is feverishly suppressing the national and democratic revolutionary struggles in Asia, Africa and Latin America. It is tightening its control over all its allies. In order to smash the U.S. imperialist criminal plan for world hegemony, the people throughout the world and all countries subjected to U.S. aggression, control, interference and bullying should form the broadest possible united front and intensify their common struggle.

The people of the socialist countries should unite. U.S. imperialism will never tolerate the existence and development of the socialist camp. U.S. imperialism is a menace to the Soviet Union, China and all other socialist countries, and its ultimate object is to destroy the socialist camp. The Soviet leaders' hankering for U.S.-Soviet co-operation to dominate the world is but an idle dream. By undermining the unity of the socialist camp, the Soviet leaders violate the interests of the people of the Soviet Union and all other socialist countries and cater to the needs of U.S. imperialism.

The peoples of Asia, Africa, Latin America and the whole world should unite. U.S. imperialism is the biggest international exploiter and an international gendarme trying to suppress the revolutionary movement of the

people of the world; it is the centre of world reaction, the chief bulwark of colonialism and the implacable enemy of the people the world over. In order to win and defend independence and to achieve liberation, it is imperative to oppose U.S. imperialism.

The American people, including the workers, farmers, revolutionary intellectuals and other enlightened persons, should unite. The reactionary policy followed by the U.S. ruling circles runs diametrically counter to the interests of the American people. It is U.S. imperialism, not the American people, that the people of the world oppose. The interests of the American people and the other peoples of the world are identical.

All peace-loving countries and people should unite. Unscrupulously pursuing its policies of aggression and war and threatening the independence and security of all countries, U.S. imperialism is the most dangerous enemy of world peace. In order to defend world peace, it is necessary to oppose U.S. imperialism.

All countries subjected to U.S. aggression, control, interference and bullying should unite. U.S. imperialism plunders the wealth of other countries with the utmost rapacity, infringes upon the sovereignty of other countries in the crudest manner and interferes in the affairs of other countries most arrogantly, trying in a thousand and one ways to trample others underfoot. All countries which refuse to be "satellites" or "vassal states" of the United States have no alternative but to join hands against this despot.

In short, it is possible for all forces excluding U.S. imperialism and its lackeys to unite. Despite the different political beliefs among the peoples and the different social systems in various countries, there is not a single country



or people in the world today which is not subjected to the aggression and threats of U.S. imperialism. This is the objective basis for the establishment of the broadest united front against U.S. imperialism. The plans of U.S. imperialism for world conquest have resulted in world-wide opposition, the very opposite of what they set out to achieve.

The socialist countries and the proletarian Parties of all countries should certainly stand at the forefront of the struggle against U.S. imperialism. The Chinese people have been struggling unswervingly to safeguard and strengthen the unity of the people of the countries of the socialist camp, to strengthen the unity of the people of the Asian, African and Latin American countries and to strengthen the unity of the people of all continents of the world. can people) subject to U.S. imperialist aggression, control, interference and bullying, in a joint fight against U.S. imperialism.
