Dear N.O. Attention International type people,

1. Under separate cover I am mailing material published by the Swedish comrades on the war in Vietnam in Swedish. This material is apparently quite good. Thorstad should look through it in case there is something we should run in IP. They were a little worried about I.P.'s coverage of the anti-war movement in Sweden. They feared we were not criticizing the reformist "sign now" line of the prime minister and the Maoist. I explained that they should write for IP, everyone agreed etc. The statement of the Swedish convention on the settlement is not included. That will be mailed from Sweden. That should definitely be run in IP.

2. In Stockholm they said they needed more Militants in their HQ. That they seal out what they get. I know nothing about the arrangements for sending the Militant. We must study an airmail bundle set up via our distributing point in London. Also is there any way the print shop could run ~~ex~~ extra copies of World Outlook during our Argentine campaign and airmail some to all HQs in Europe? Especially Germany, Sweden, Denmark, and Austria would be important.

3. Could you mail an airmail copy of the World Outlook of Feb. 2, 1973 to Tom in Stockholm and write on it "Peter says to read article on page 3"

4. Larsen and Barbara Jensen will try to write regularly for IP on events in Denmark. In return we should airmail IP to them free. And also to help them in this task they should receive the Militant airmail at half cost. They will pay 20 dollars for the Militant. We should also mail them the ISR airmail free for one year.

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5. We should study the Swedish proposal for actions around the convening of the international conference on Vietnam to educate on the continued presence of imperialism in Vietnam.

6. On the phone Jack and MA agreed to send the following-

- a. The Sabado Enero report bulletin
  - three copies to Aarhus Denmark
  - three copies to Goteborg Sweden
  - One Copy to Bo in Stockholm
  - Five copies to Dan Styron in Mannheim Germany
- Add to this
  - One copy to Larsen Jensen in Copenhagen
- b. The United Sec. minutes on the publishing of the unico camino and the Lorenzo document
  - three copies to Stockholm HQ
  - One copy to Benny in Lund Sweden
  - two copies to Aarhus Denmark
  - two copies to Goteborg Sweden mark attention Hoken

All of this material should be air mail.

7. From now till world congress I would suggest we up the air mail Militant to the Aarhus local and the Goteborg local from one to three.

8. Jack should consider attaching a tape cassette to his phone to save time in passing on information.

9. We sold three hundred dollars of literature at the Swedish congress. 150 attended.

10. Neto attended some of the convention. So did some other official of his group. He purchased a few books including LT.

11. We should organize the sending of greetings to such conferences better. The comrades take it very seriously and are extremely pleased that their existence is recognized. Thus Ed Shaw should write Argentina, and maybe Blanco to send a telegram to the Austrian conference and Japan.

Dear Comrades,

People who begin to think we may be correct on L.A. want to receive the MILITANT + I.P. more rapidly than surface mail. Current air mail rates are prohibitive. Peter + I discussed the possibility of including Continental subscribers on the same type plan currently available in Britain. Of course because of the increased postage from London the price would have to be higher than the current special rates for Britain. Perhaps £2 rather than £1 for the same length of time. This may make too much work in London also. The problem is however that people <sup>will</sup> want the Militant more rapidly and we need a uniform rate and subsidizing individual subs from New York is too costly. I think we should do something like a £2.00, 20 week Militant or 10 week IP sub for the Continent. Peter also made an arrangement with
