Dear Comrade,

I wish to draw your attention to our letters of 1978 ~~which~~ which addressed to the following :

- (1) To, International Relgoirest Ltd., dated 27th October, 1978.
- (2) To, International Bureau, I.M.G., dated 26th September, 1978.
- (3) To, Tariq Ali, C/o Socialist Challenge, dated 3rd March, 1978.

To our greatest surprise, none of our letter was replied last year. Our sided correspondence yielded some temporary results. The head quarter of our section received airmail copies of "Socialist Challenge" for sea-mail. And that is all : we welcomed the thaw that occurred between our relations as due to some mysterious reasons the leading cadres of our section were bypassed by your section on whose behalf various comrades had visited India from 1971 to 1976. During this period and since the year 1947 our party used to post your section Internal Bulletin and our Journal Proletarian Politics by air-mail. We wrote couple of letters for the critical observations of the material sent and comradely collaboration. Imperialist colonial domination had brought close collaboration between political parties of the working class of India and England in past. In spite of some changes since 1947, the basis for the closest collaboration between the English section and the sections of the ex-colonies of British empire within the overall ambit of F.I. still valid. Hence our repeated reminders to your section regarding this during the last five years were sent.

We had not concealed our limitation of human-power and inadequacy in political sphere. There are lot of errors where we can mutually assist, provided there is will to pull in that direction.

When our section was put on mailing list of "Socialist Challenge" and "International", we assumed that the phase of collaboration, atleast through correspondence had begun. And we wrote letters mentioned by us in this very despatch.

It seems that some hitch regarding us may have arisen among the comrades in-charge of colonies of British. Sudden stopping of post Socialist Challenge, International and total lack of written response to our efforts, a courtesy to acknowledge are the indications as per our understanding. We can very well understand the peculiar manner of Com. Tariq Ali who had and has some priorities to pursue regarding us. During his various trips to India, he had no time for comradely conversation with us due to the reasons best known to him, nor he had time to reply our letters or read our 'Internal Bulletin' and 'Proletarian Politics', at his leisure. But what about others? The responsible comrades in charge of section like ours, it seems, have no time to react to the programmatical materials appeared in our 'Internal Bulletin'. And we all shout full throatedly for world socialist revolution: Is it not strange and stupid our part?

We firmly believe that whatever have been happened and is happening between our sections is not desirable rather it is regrettable and deplorable. The question is not to consider certain comrades deliberately responsible for this. The point is to call halt end to come on the right track for our mutual benefit.

We would like to meet you comrades at the time of the world congress. Indian government after denying my passport for years to-gather, atleast has issued pass-port to me. I definitely intend to attend the world congress if I would get visa. In that case, I will positively come to England and take initiative to pursue our point of a view, whether you comrades like it or not.

Meanwhile, may we hope to be acknowledged, and resumption of air-mailing the 'Socialist Challenge' while an air-mailing three copies of current No. 7. The reason is that the C.C. members stay at Baroda, Jannagar and Bombay. Why do not you go through our letters,
