

Dear Comrade,

Bill Fredrick, a member of the Philadelphia YSA, has just come out with a recording of anti-war songs called Hey Hey LBJ. Bill sang at the Washington Conference of the National Mobilization Committee in May as well as the first March on Washington in 1965.

The recording is put out by Crisis Records, a small recording company which, like Merit Publishers, has no easy access to mass marketing facilities. It consists of twelve anti-war songs never before recorded in the United States. Done in a highly professional manner, the record clearly reflects the politics of the growing anti-war movement.

It is important that this record be given the widest possible distribution. Local anti-war groups and Mobilization Committees can use it as a fundraiser and should be encouraged to mention it in their publications and meetings. It can be sold to bookstores and record shops etc.

The record is available wholesale, in quantities of ten or more, at \$2.95, and can be sold retail at \$4.95 or at the markdown price of \$3.95. Individual copies should be sold at \$4.95. Orders of less than fifty (50) should be addressed to:
