Dear Sir: I beg leave to acknowledge receipt of your communication of the 30th ult.

About 9:30 o'clock last Saturday evening, Franklin Hall, which is the headquarters of the Socialist Party and the office of the Buffalo Socialist was a desolate scene.

At the time about twenty persons were on the premises. In the office of the paper five or six people were at dressing envelopes, while in the large hall several discussions were going on with twelve or fifteen listeners and participants.

In the meantime an alarm of fire had been turned in and several members of the party were busy carrying out the most valuable records of the party and the Buffalo Socialist.

**THE FEMINIST MOVEMENT**  
By Ida Craddock-Hadditt.  
Early Phases.  
(Concluded from last week)  
Revolutionary Period.

This year of 1848 was a time of revolutionary awakening with far-reaching results in many directions. It marked the beginning of the century revolution in Europe that sent Marx and Engels into exile, and gave to human history the economic searchlight of the Communist Manifesto. It saw the gathering of the first woman suffrage convention at Seneca Falls, N. York, called by Lucretia Mott, Lucy Stone and Elizabeth Cady Stanton, after being refused the right to sit at the delegates to the anti-slavery convention in London.

It was in this same year at Geneva, N. Y., that a medical college first opened its doors to women. Dr. Elizabeth Blackwell being the woman ad-mitted. When she went to Paris to study the Paris correspondent to the New York Journal of Commerce wrote that she was "the only woman in the most rabid type, and that her undertaking is an entering wedge to a systematic attack on society by the whole sex."

**Using the Ballot.**  
When she returned to New York in Massachusetts—from 1891 to 1892—for all elective offices.

A woman at one time was governor of Pennsylvania—William Penn's wife. In 1870 in 1770 the first woman, Mrs. John General St. Clair's army against the Indians. Most of them died a soldier's death upon the field of battle in defense of their homes.

Women served as messengers in the army, as cooks, messengers on the battlefield, soldiers in disguise, defenders of themselves and their children in the same old-fashioned way. They were imprisoned for heresy, burned, hanged and drowned as witches.

They rendered immense service in the anti-slavery agitation and the Civil War. They were at the front when the men had struck and their cause must wait until the pending question was settled. After the war women attempted to do the same old-fashioned way. They were arrested, tried and convicted. When they were denied the right to practice law they took their cases to the Supreme Court.

**COUNCILMEN FIGHT SOCIALIST MAYOR**  
While the Socialists in New Castle control the Mayor's office, they are in a minority in the City Council. The Demo-Rep. combine holds up nearly everything of a constructive nature before the council, and at the same time supports substantially everything that the corporations want, which is in turn vetoed by the Mayor, and as the combine lacks one vote of having a two-thirds majority to pass an ordinance over the head of the chief executive, a deadlock frequently ensues.

**HOLD THE FORT**  
The comrades of Edgewater, Cal., are evidently made of the right stuff. Comrade Kirkman writes:

"We put a ticket in the field three years ago and ran a close second. The following year, fearing defeat, the old parties fused, and after the count we had fourteen to elect the board. This past April, the old outfit discovered their interests were identical and the wets, Drs. Democrats, Republicans, Bull Moose, etc., were made to fuse with us on a 'union ticket,' etc. Nothing doing! After the count we took everything at the point of the bayonet. It was an effort to dislodge the old 'gang.'"

Then the fusion gang pulled off an amazing stunt. It was a desperate game, but it didn't work. The old board was re-elected, and the old board attempted to appoint their successors, but we "qualified" and defeated their plot. Then they refused to turn over office or property, and they brought their proceedings to get books. We won (in the court at that), and to date have been getting along very well."
