FOURTH OF NEGROES' DEATHS CAUSED BY CONSUMPTION

The latest number of the Chicago Board of Health's series of leaflets on "How to Keep Well" is devoted to "The Negro and Consumption."

"During the past four years the death rate from among the negroes in Chicago was 23.7 per cent higher than the rate among the white population."

"Putting it in another way it would read like this: Of the 3,701 negro deaths for the past four years, 43.5 per cent were caused by the chief internal diseases—tuberculosis, 24.8; pneumonia, 14.8 per cent, and bronchitis, 1.9 per cent."

"Just at this time attention has been called to the consumption death rate among the negroes of the country by an article in one of the leading magazines in which this subject is discussed."

"Chicago today has negro physicians who are able and skillful men, and who are deeply interested in helping their own people to a better knowledge of health and sanitation."

"Every member of the family is in danger of an attack of the rabies, brought on from using the milk of a diseased cow. Two pairs of the children are being fed with this milk."
