More Socialist Speakers Arrested and Meetings Suppressed

(Special to the Daily Socialist.) Los Angeles, Cal., March 4.—There is a lively war on in this city between the Socialists and the police department over the right of the Socialists to hold street meetings.

At this meeting Forest Hubbard, a man named Roberts and Mrs. Hazel Hubbard, with her baby in her arms, were arrested.

Invokes the Constitution The arrest of Lindwall and Mrs. Corker occurred at Seventh street and Grand avenue, where about 500 people were assembled.

Lindwall was then placed under arrest and Mrs. Corker mounted the box. She said only a few words, when she also was arrested.

VAN CLEAVE IN NEW DIATRIBE

Capitalist Bell Wether Fears "Large Funds" of Trade Unions

(Special to the Daily Socialist.) Indianapolis, Ind., March 4.—James W. Van Cleave of St. Louis, president of the National Association of Manufacturers, has come out with a new denunciation of the American Federation of Labor and its affiliated societies.

But before we rejoice too loudly at these victories for law and justice, let me tell you that at this moment bills are before Congress to change the statutes and thus to reverse the beneficial work just done by the Supreme Court.

Some of the labor unionists are denouncing in support of the constitution, and for its better and firmer enforcement of the laws.

Remember, though the labor trust is small, it is well organized. Large funds are in its control. Some of its heads are as unscrupulous men as are to be found outside of the penitentiaries.

Encouraged by its success for years past in frightening cowardly and truckling politicians, the American Federation of Labor is pushing these measures, swinging its club over the heads of lawmakers in Congress and of party leaders and presidential candidates in the endeavor to force them to do its bidding.

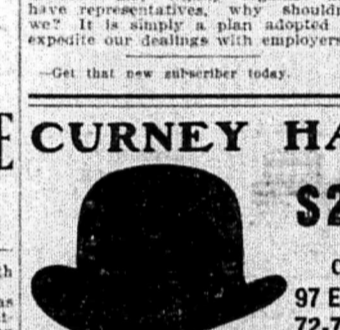
NO HOPE FOR IDLE ON FARMS

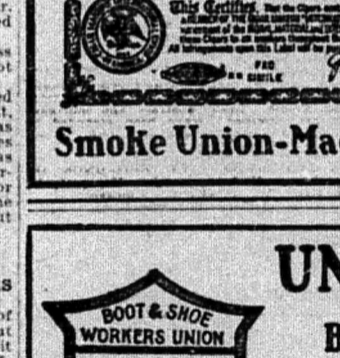
