Friedrichshafen, Aug. 5.—Count Zeppelin now is flying from Mayence to Friedrichshafen in an attempt to make the longest airship voyage in history.

FALLING WALL SINKS FIREBOAT. Crew Is Imperiled When Crush Comes in Big Elevator Blaze.

The steel fireboat Illinois, the pride of the Chicago fire department, was sent to the bottom of the river at 3:30 a. m. today as the spectacular culmination of the disastrous blaze which wiped out two grain elevators, freight-houses and other buildings with a loss of \$1,588,000 yesterday afternoon.

Police Try Bluffing. It is said that the police did not know by what law they could order the fireboat to return to the river.

Injured in Collapse. Three engineers and four stokers, together with Captain Lyons, were on the boat and were rescued with difficulty.

Was Stationed at Slip. The fireboat Illinois was stationed at the entrance to a slip which runs between the two partly destroyed elevators.

The escape of the men was miraculous. The work will be started today by the Great Lake Towing and Dredging company.

Revised Estimate of Losses. A revised estimate of the total losses has been made as follows: Fireboat Illinois \$50,000. Elevator B—Owned by the Burlington Railroad \$200,000.
