FIND HACKED BODY OF BOY

Police Seek Identity of Torso Discovered in Drainage Canal

The police are making a city wide canvass procuring descriptions of missing boys in an effort to identify the dismembered body found in sections of the Illinois and Michigan and drainage canals at South Lawndale.

Oyster Bay Aug. 6.—Four women suffragists who came to this place to interview President Roosevelt and hold a meeting received a chilly reception. It was announced that the president was not receiving callers, and before the meeting a heavy rain storm set in and the suffragists left without accomplishing either of their objects.

Not Dealt by Treatment Mrs. Wanda said: "The fact that President Roosevelt did not want to see us does not matter at all. It is enough that he has refused. We have chosen to come here for obvious reasons, and it is sufficient for our purpose that we are addressing the Oyster Bay people in front of the government executive offices.
