WILL PAY TO CONVICT LABOR

Employers' Association Offers \$1,500 For Speyer's Assailants

The Chicago Employers' association yesterday stopped long enough from planning how to put competitors out of business by high-class slugging methods to offer a reward for the assailants of Weir B. Speyer, evidently believing that it had an excellent chance to fasten the crime on the teamsters' organization.

The association offered a reward of \$1,500 for the capture of the three men who assaulted Speyer, and do not hesitate in declaring publicly that the milk dealer was assaulted because of his refusal to join the Milk Wagon Drivers' union.

Inspector D. D. Davies yesterday afternoon refused to take up the case of William H. Robinson, the nonunion Canadian pressman who is working for Peole Bros., and who is seeking union slugs after him. He believes the United States government should furnish him a badge and put detectives on the track of all members of the pressmen's union.

An official of the pressmen's union last night told a reporter for the Daily Socialist that the two police officers who by Robinson were not members of the union, and he believed that it was another scheme of the few employers still holding out against the eight-hour movement to discredit the strikers and the union.
