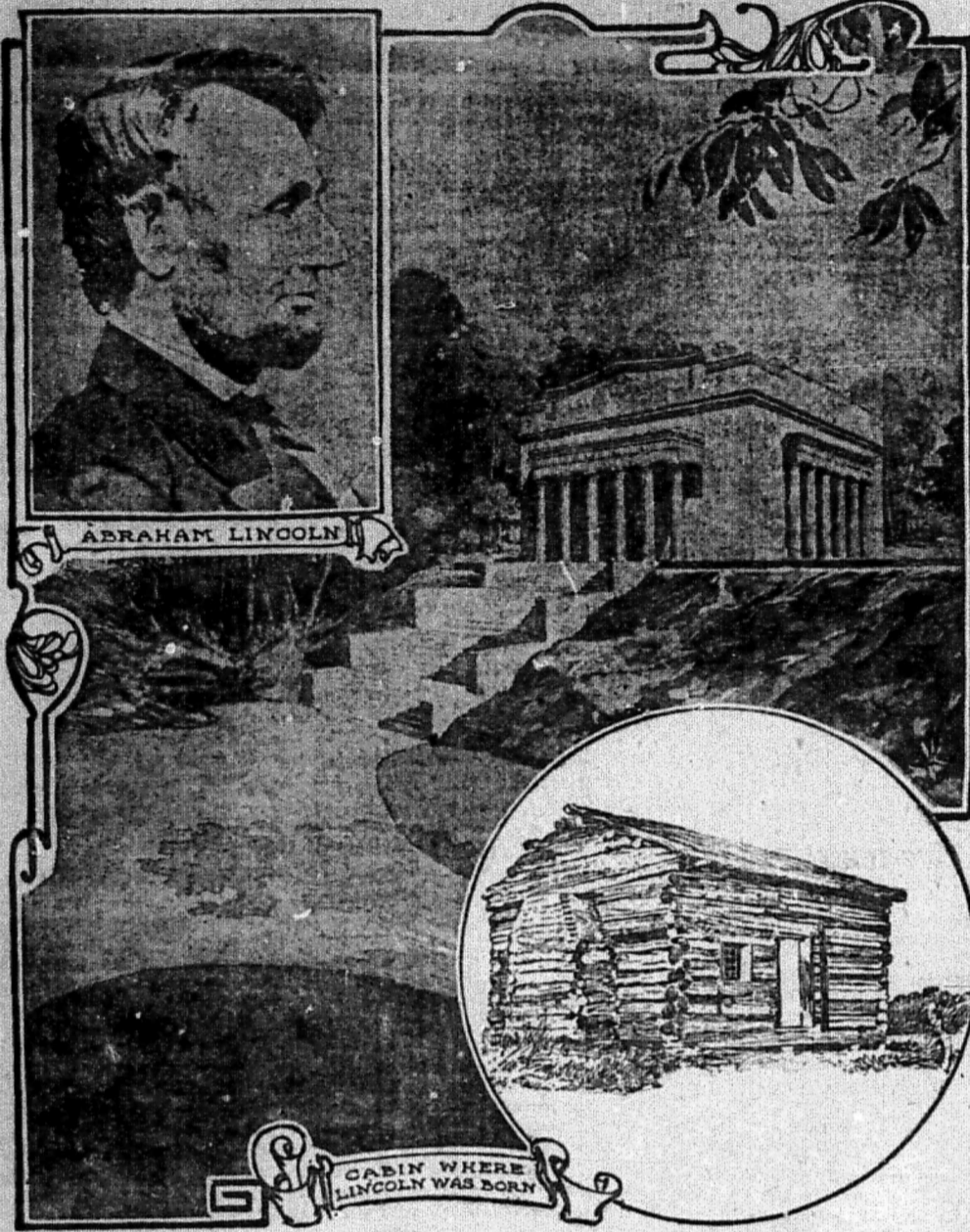

ABRAHAM LINCOLN MEMORIAL



The picture reproduced herewith was made from the first photograph ever taken of the Abraham Lincoln memorial erected on the farm near Hodgenville, Ky., and on the exact spot where Lincoln was born.

Lincoln was born. The memorial was built entirely by popular subscription through the efforts of the Lincoln Farm association, of which Governor Joseph W. Folk of Missouri is president. The memorial structure covers the little cabin where Lincoln first saw the light of day on February 12, 1809. On the one hundredth anniversary of that date, which occurs next February, elaborate dignified ceremonies will be held on the farm.

Children's Teeth

This is one of the most important features in the care of children; it is not enough that they be fed, bathed and clothed, but the care of their teeth and nails is necessary also, if these are to be preserved in good order until adult life. Even the infant of a year old should have his teeth cleaned, a soft handkerchief on the finger of the mother or nurse, wetted and touched with magnesia, being the best thing for the purpose. Later on, a tiny brush with soft bristles may be used with magnesia as tooth powder. A little orris root added to this will make it more agreeable. Magnesia is recommended for arresting decay and keeping the teeth white. As the child gets older he may be taught to do this service for himself. The hair also should be regularly brushed, which encourages growth and a glossy appearance. Attention given to the hair in childhood is generally abundantly repaid later on.
