The masses of reading and earnestly thinking workers and peasants of the First Workers' Republic have been growing rapidly in volume sinced the Bolshevik Revolution of Nov. 7, 1917, and will continul to grow. The circulation and influence of "Pravda" will follow in the wake of this growth.
