

CARPENTERS OF DETROIT SIT EXPULSION PLANS

Reputate Hutcheson Act in Two Locals

DETROIT, Mich.—The reactionary Brotherhood of Carpenters of Detroit was reported to Hutcheson's tactics to protect Hutcheson's stipulantes from the rank and file resolution repudiating the expulsion of William Reynolds by the general assembly and demanding a trial before his local union, in accordance with the constitution, was reported and amended to effect that the reputation be changed to protest.

After an appeal from the arbitrary ruling of the reactionary president on a motion for the previous question had been sustained by a vote of 24 to 10 the amendment was carried by a three to one vote and "reputate" was confined to the resolution. The rank and file members of the Carpenters in Detroit towards the arbitrary and reactionary expulsion of Brother Reynolds.

At the same time, local union 1191 is declining with a grace to let Reynolds have had acting for him in that organization, to acknowledge the actions and intentions of the rank and file union and to ascertain the racial affiliations of its members.

The local union in question recently earned the hatred of Hutcheson and the pay roll gang, by outspoken criticism of the general executive board, for voting a vote of 118 for Reson for president against 2 for Hutcheson, Hutcheson demanded the local union to expel some five weeks ago, and according to the officials of the union, they have taken care that he disappeared while three payrollers were present in the union and have not been heard from since.
