Housing Outlook Grows LENIN SCHOOL Worse in New York City, Capitalism's Pet Jewel

By J. LOUIS ENGDAHL

TODAY, New York City, the nation's metropolis, stands before the country confessing, not only that housing conditions within its borders are stadily growing worse, but that it is helpiese to remedy the attuation. This product of control of the co

The needs of the workers are few. They are not permitted to have many under capitalism. A little to ast, some clothes to wear, a hole to fluor, that is all. New York, the richest city in the capitalist world falls in providing all of these. This housing report to the state legislature makes no mention of the thousands who endlessly walk the streets, sleeping in parks alleways or out-of-the-way corners. It does not concern itself with homes for "The 36" who were found huddled together just the other day in a subway station. The case of these is turned over to the police. They are arrested. It is a crime to be homeless. Yet capitalism spawns many homeless.

The housing commission only concerns itself with workers who have fairly good lobs, who work hard from day to day, who earn up to \$2.500 per year. For these new construction makes no provision. They constitute two-thirds of the population, and for them, "new construction has brought no improvement in housing conditions." In other words, to get attention from the housing profiteers in New York City, one must earn more than \$2.500 annually, in order to pay the bandit's toll. But that is not within the reach of the masses who labor.

What happens? The commission tells even that. Families are forced to move out of apartments, even those built before the war, and find "something chaep" in what is called an "old-law tenement." Listen to this:


