SHANGHAI, China, July 2.—The foreign settlement authorities have ordered a partial demobilization of the white guard "volunteers corps" after a solid month of continuous warfare. Despite the fact that the strike is as tight as ever and there is no hope in its abating.

## AMERICAN GOVERNMENT SPENDS ON WAR MORE THAN ALL OTHER NATIONS, TO EXTEND ITS CAPITALIST EMPIRE

The Wall Street Journal in a statistical article shows that the United States spends a larger proportion of its budget on military than any of the leading countries of Europe. The article apparently makes an attempt to break down the popular prejudice against treating the debts of France and Italy.

"Actually," says the journal, the European nations "are all spending less than the United States for defense," and many of them proportionately.

Military Cost Increase. "According to budget estimates the United States will spend this year for arms and navy departments the sum of \$475,800,000 or about 13.7 per cent of total expenditures. This is a notable increase over previous years. Military and naval costs in the United States year being 10.3 per cent and in 1923 9.4 per cent.

In contrast with the United States, Great Britain is spending 13.1 per cent of her total expenditures for military and navy. France 11.1 per cent.
