

# WILL NOT STOP FIGHT TO RID U. S. G. W. OF WHILE SIGN WHITE GANG, SAY LEFT LEAGUE LOCALS

NEW YORK CITY, Aug. 5.—That the members of the International Ladies' Garment Workers' Union in the city of New York are not deceived or placated by the resignations from the joint board of the White Gang and Fabergé, is shown from the following statement of the Joint Action Committee of Local 2, 9 and 22, just issued:

"By the JOINT ACTION COMMITTEE OF LOCALS 2, 9 AND 22.  
In order to satisfy and quiet the members who are dissatisfied with them, the SIGNA machine tool Fabergé and FORTINCO to resign.

The same signman who just assured the public that all Communists are making noise, now is no cloakmaker, now this same signman is forced to disown his two principal aids, Fabergé and Fortinco's negotiations are only throwing sand in the eyes of the workers. They think that the SIGNA machine tool is a red mob that can be quered with the kind of his resignation. ## AS WE SEE IT

THERE may be a general strike in the coal industry unless the hard coal miners and the miners' union can come to terms before September 1. There are hints that a national strike would be called by the mine leaders, for the double-barreled purpose of forcing the anthracite workers to come to terms and also to halt the demoralizing effects of the Jacksonville agreement on the union in the bituminous fields. This would be a good strategy.

It is hoped if the miners' union had sufficient class conscious leadership, they would not allow the situation in the soft coal fields to exist twenty-four hours without a fight. It is generally admitted that only 30 per cent of the coal is mined in the soft coal fields. The rest comes out of unmined pits. At the rate of progress made by the open shop method the production of the entire bituminous industry mined by such labor. This process should be halted at once. A general strike in the anthracite, hard and soft, is the only way to avert the problem.
