The sixth Langkats Provincial Congress, Trade Unions representing 115,000 working men and women, has elaborated in its general constitution and statute: "We express our profound satisfaction over your formation together with the All-Russian Trade Union Congress, an Anglo-Russian Trade Union Congress, and wherever the masses of workers see in its aim the outlet of the general desire to destroy the capitalist system and demand the formation of a united trade union international. We know from our own revolutionary experience of the international workers' movement, that the capitalist system is an inherent line of development of the working class, will not best be done by any means of reform, but only by the force of a united front of workers in the trade union and a united trade union international."

Germany. The Berlin branch of the Metal Workers' Union, the largest of all the trade union branches in that city, have unanimously passed at a general meeting the following resolution for the formation of a united trade union international: "The international capitalist offensive directed against the working class in all countries, and the fact that the capitalists are utilizing all the political and economic means at their disposal, to cut wages, and to reduce or abolish altogether the meager social rights the worker still enjoys, urgently demand the formation of a united trade union international, nationally as well as internationally. The trade union congress therefore attracts the national executive of the German Trade Union Federation, which has resulted in an agreement with the International Federation of Trade Unions, that all trade union organizations of the world, regardless of their political views, should be admitted to any trade union international, as well as to a single national one, as being in a single front."

France. The struggle for unity gains more and more the confidence of active trade unionists throughout the world. As in Europe and America, the question of trade union unity is becoming also the most important question. We must break with the old trade unionism and open up a wider horizon to the trade union organization, national and international. A joint mass meeting at Lille has resolved to support the campaign of the T. U. E. L. for unity in France, and has added: "We consider the 'parliamentary' method of the British trade unionists which has resulted in an agreement with the International Federation of Trade Unions, that all trade union organizations of the world, regardless of their political views, should be admitted to any trade union international, as well as to a single national one, as being in a single front."
