

U. S. SUPREME COURT REFUSES APPEAL FROM CALIFORNIA

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 25.—The appeal before the United States supreme court of Anita Whitney, former member of the U. S. Labor Party, was refused today for a review of her conviction in the California state courts for violation of the state criminal syndicalism law, was denied. The United States supreme court refused to take jurisdiction over the case and refused to listen to the appeal.

Anita Whitney of Oakland, California, was convicted of violating the state criminal syndicalism act which forbids "membership or association in groups teaching the violent overthrow of the government or the unlawful destruction of property." She was charged with membership in the Communist Labor Party and also in assisting the U. S. to raise funds for the defense of many members who were arrested under the state criminal syndicalism act.
