COMMUNIST PAPER EXPOSES NEW SECRET FRANCO-GERMAN ACCORD FOR WAR ON THE SOVIET UNION

Reason Revealed for Recent German-Polish Pact to Settle Polish Corridor Row

Joint Military Action Planned Secretly "To Destroy Bolshevism" By War

PARIS. (By Mail).—The official organ of the Communist Party, "Humanité," publishes the following article with the title "A Franco-German Military Alliance Against the Soviet Union." On Saturday and Sunday German newspapers published interesting details concerning negotiations which took place a few months ago between the French and German industrialists, soldiers, and apparently well-informed capitalists declare that towards the end of last month a little party was held in the house of the German general von der Lippe, a party at which the participants did not content themselves with eating and drinking alone.

Arnold Rechberg, the nitrate king and Monsieur Paul Reynaud, the friend of Kerillis, the confident of Poincaré, took part in it. This notorious patriot is said to have developed a detailed programme of a Franco-German Entente directed chiefly against the Soviet Union. In order to win his hearers for his project, M. Reynaud did not hesitate to say that France would be prepared to make considerable sacrifices.

According to him, leading French officials were prepared to consider the return of the Polish corridor as part-payment for the military alliance. In whose name did the Paris deputy speak? In Berlin rumor has it that he represented a very important political personage in France. In any case, it is of interest to point out here that the friend of Poincaré was at the same time mentioned as the future Under-Secretary of State in the "concentration Cabinet," which Briand imagined would be so simple.

It is also declared in the German capital that a French general was closely connected with these bizarre negotiations. In an interview, Arnold Rechberg tries to confirm the disclosures of "Der Tag" and "Der Lokalanzeiger." He added only that for his part in the negotiations he secured the cooperation of all German politicians.

These are the facts. We understand very well that they embarrass the Echo de Paris. When one curses Eugen Berger and his Stahlhelmers very days, then it is of course very embarrassing to have people in the house who negotiate with German generals and German nationalist politicians.

But that is only a subordinate part of the question. In our eyes the most important significance is seen in connection with these negotiations of Poincaré's confident, a very definite tendency of Franco-German policy was shown.

For years the German nitrate king, Arnold Rechberg, has been investing his anti-Soviet activities. In the spring of 1927, a short time before the breach between Great Britain and the Soviet Union, he went to London where he proposed an Anglo-Franco-German economic agreement with regard to the mining, iron and steel industries. Without hearing about the bush, he declared that the political aim of this alliance was "the struggle against the increasing danger of Bolshevism." Industrialists like Lord

Melchett (Sir Alfred Mond), the friend of the leaders of the British trade unions, welcomed Rechberg's initiative with great pleasure. The journey of the German industrialist was not without result. A few weeks later de Monzie took up Rechberg's ideas at a meeting of French foreign commerce council. The late Jacques Seddoux developed them in the "Temps" and caused the Russian counter-revolutionary Angur to comment upon them in the French Revue "Pax." The French Ambassador in Berlin, Magerie, discussed them with the leading personages in the Wilhelmstrasse.

What was, in short, the program of the large-scale industrialists from the other side of the Rhine? Rechberg himself took the trouble to lay down the main lines of his program about a year ago in the "Vossische Zeitung."

Rechberg wants to see the economic co-operation between France and Germany as expressed in the formation of the Chemical Trust and the Steel Trust, crowned by a political and military alliance.

Germany and France would then guarantee their frontiers mutually "against any attack from a third party." A ratio of power would be agreed upon between the French and German armies of 5:3; that is to say, a French army of 500,000 men would mean a German army of 300,000 men, technical equipment being equal. A General Staff would be formed of French and German officers and this General Staff would command both armies.

This General Staff would have the right to inspect all French and German troops, and would work out the plans for the joint defence of the French and German frontiers. The Belgian army would be drawn into the Franco-German military alliance. And finally, the French war industries would supply the new Germany with armaments to an extent ranging from one-quarter to one-third, irrespective of whether such supplies represented the first regular supply of the new German army.

This proposal is apparently very seductive, for the French industrialists regard it with growing favor.

Even Marshal Foch was caught by this plan of the nitrate industrialist. As the spokesman of the Comité des Forges the French marshal recognized the Franco-German military alliance as a valuable instrument for the organization of a war against the Soviet Union. Always under the influence of his idea of "destroying Bolshevism at one blow," he gave an interview to the "Neue Wiener Zeitung" in which he declared: "We cannot permit a handful of criminal tyrants to rule over more than half the European continent and over wide areas of Asia. But until France and Germany are united, nothing is to be done in the matter." Foch concluded his interview with the words: "Please give General Hoffman, the great pioneer of a military alliance against Bolshevism, my very best greetings."

Rechberg's plans were however faced with serious obstacles, the Rhineland was still occupied and

10,000 SIGNATURES OBTAINED BY 2 ACTIVE COMMUNISTS IN DRIVE

Sales of Bitter Exploitation Related By Toilers As They Pledge Party Support

The honors go to Hugh McKiernan and Louis Donk! These two workers gathered more signatures in the signature collection drive to the Communist ticket on the ballot than any others. McKiernan broke all previous records with a total of 1400 signatures. Donk gathered 600.

McKiernan, a worker in one of the textile industries, is an active member of the Boro Park Section of the Communist Party and collected his signatures in the 16th Assembly district, where Morris Kushinsky is a Communist candidate. He works mostly among Italian and Irish workers. Donk gathered his signatures among the Negro, Latin-American and Italian workers of Harlem.

Both workers were emphatic in declaring that their experiences convinced them of the growing influence of the Communist Party. "I met a sympathetic response from nearly all the working class families that I visited," McKiernan said. "Many of the Italian workers first wouldn't sign, being suspicious of political parties. But when I explained that the Communist Party is a workers' party and fights for the workers, they readily signed."

"The Irish workers that I came contact with were mostly tractor workers. They told me that conditions on the L. R. T. and B. T. are constantly getting worse. The Irish sell-outs of the American Federation of Labor have com-

pletely disillusioned them and they are ready for militant leadership. They also had no faith in the three capitalist parties, but showed great interest in the Communist election program."

Donk found the workers in Harlem bitter against their exploiters. He secured a number of new Party members among the Negro workers, while others joined the Harlem Tenants League and a number of Latin-American workers became members of the Spanish Workers Club. He is maintaining his contacts with many of the workers he met and is supplying them regularly with working class literature. A beating he received at the hands of Zionist fascists failed to stop him in his collection of signatures.

McKiernan and Donk were two of the most outstanding among a large number of workers, who despite the intensified campaign of intimidation carried on by capitalist party henchmen and the Zionist and "socialist" terror drive, gathered 20,000 signatures to put the party of the working class on the ballot.

Czech Mine Strikers Solid

Police protected Boess and escorted him home.

Fascist Referendum Yet to Win

BERLIN, Nov. 4.—Although Hugenberg's fascist plebiscite passed in the last day the required percentage needed to submit it to a vote, thus surprising even its own supporters, the State Commission must decide if the plebiscite goes before the country. If it does the prospects are hopeless, as twenty million votes are required.

Bacho Sacho Executed

TEHERAN, Persia, Nov. 5.—Reports from Afghanistan state that Bacho Sacho, bandit and "water boy" tool whom British imperialism used as a pawn to seize the Afghan throne in the encirclement of the Soviet Union, was executed with 11 of his followers on Nov 3 at Kabul, by order of Nadir Khan.

Reformists Plan to Sell Out 80,000 Coal Miners in Reich Pits

BERLIN (by mail)—At the conference in Halle of the organizations under the wage tariff for the Central German coal mining district, the opposit'nal representatives demanded a wage increase of two marks a shift. The reformist majority rejected this demand and adopted instead a decision to give notice to end the tariff on the 30 of November and to demand an increase of 1 mark per shift. The text of the reformist decision shows clearly that they have no intention of conducting any serious struggle for wage increases. 80,000 workers are involved.

the reparations problem was still unsolved. It is clear that Rechberg would gladly have speeded up matters, and that he was working feverishly for the liquidation of the last war in order to organize his new anti-Soviet war. Rechberg came to the experts conference in Paris. He was to be seen in the hotel where the conference was held, but he was also to be seen on the Quai d'Orsay and in the rooms of the Prime Minister where "The great Lorraine" gave him a friendly welcome. Shacht made the nitrate king his most important co-operator, and the German Ambassador von Hoersch took advantage of his services.

By the way, Rechberg did not come to Paris alone, but was accompanied by General von der Lippe (the gentleman in whose house Paul Reynaud's little party took place). This General presented his plan for a joint military action of the European powers against the Soviet Union to the Entente diplomats. The adoption of the experts plan and the agreement in The Hague are the trump cards in Rechberg's game. Some people become indignant when we declare that the agreements come to in Paris, The Hague and in Geneva were directed against the Soviet Union.

These people should take a look at the happy face of the German nitrate king. The Hague Pact worked out by Hilferding, Snowden and Henderson and praised to the skies by Leon Blum, does not mean a triumph for peace, but a triumph for Rechberg and his fellow conspirators.

The insignificant hindrance which prevented a participation of Germany in anti-Soviet adventures yesterday, have been abolished today. The path for war lies open. But upon this path millions of French and German workers will arise, workers who have allied themselves with their Soviet brothers who hold power in the first workers State, and who form a revolutionary breastwork against the front of the war mongers.

NANKING LIES FLOPS AS FENG ARMY ADVANCES

Chiang Kai Shek Only A Dud Strategist

SHANGHAI, Nov. 6.—The armies of Feng Yu-hsiang have exploded the continued lying claims of Nanking and routed Chiang Kai-shek's forces north of Hankow, which is now on the point of being captured. Chiang's troops are mutinying so widely that German officers (whom Nanking has hired to furnish Chiang Kai-shek with military strategy which he never has possessed) are returning to Hankow in disgust.

News from the North states that Feng Yu-hsiang also explodes Nanking claims that Yen Hsi-shan, the "model" governor of Shansi who tricked Nanking recently with the yarn that he had "captured" Feng, is or ever was loyal to Chiang Kai-shek. Yen and Feng have worked together against Nanking, is Feng's statement.

RECRUIT WHITE GUARDS TO WAR

Bands Gather From all Lands in Manchuria

MOSCOW (By Mail).—Since the seizure of the Chinese Eastern Railway, the Russian monarchists in all countries have developed very great activity. Formations of Russian monarchist officers are going to China from all countries. According to the press in Rega, recruiters have appeared in Latvia, in order to obtain volunteers for the white guardist army in China. This activity is carried on secretly. They have succeeded in winning a few dozen volunteers who have already left the country. These volunteers are promised good wages and good positions in the anti-Bolshevist armies. In the next few days a second consignment of volunteers will leave Latvia. The extreme right-wing Latvian nationalists are participating in the recruitment.

Polish White Terror Metes Out Heavy Jail Terms for Militants

WARSAW (By Mail).—The Polish white terror in operation against the Communist and other militant workers is shown in the following cases:

BIALYSTOCK: The County Court of Bialystock sentenced M. Wrobel to two years and Sofia Schabad to five years' imprisonment for having distributed Communist literature.

POSEN: A young worker, 24, Franz Siborski, has been sentenced to six years hard labor in the County Court of Posen for possessing a few Communist leaflets.

LOMZA: O trial against 18 young workers and peasants has been opened. The accused are charged with the crime to be members of the Young Communist League. They have been in jail since March, 1928, for "investigation."

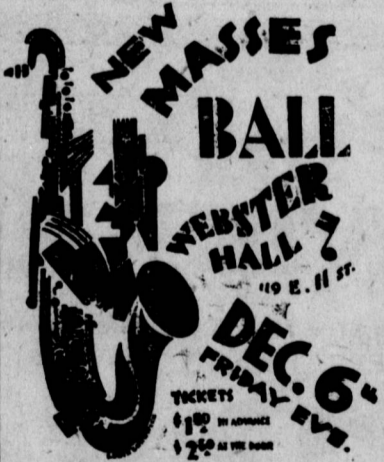
The political prisoners in the jail of Wronki, about 100, have started a hunger strike against the brutal treatment in the prisons and Pilsudski's new prison rules.

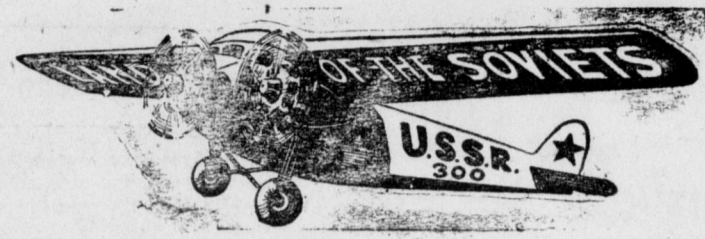
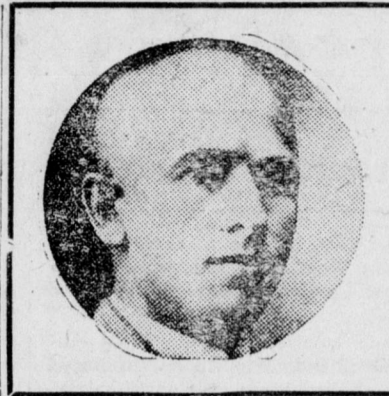
