THE beginnings of the subsequent mass unemployment that were to change everything around her, she saw, when in 1929 her youngest boy lost his job...

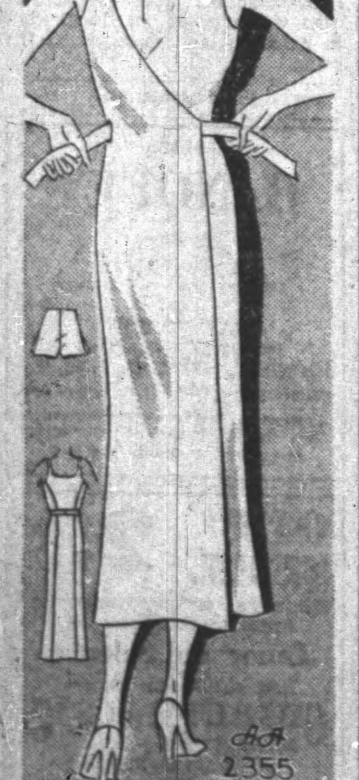

Fluids: Buttermilk, skim milk, fruit juice, broth without fat. No fat, oils or butter as such; no fatty or fried foods (pork, ham, mayonnaise, cheese, bacon)...
