Old Conviction Revised To Deport Militant

Walter Baer Is Torn from His Native-Born Wife and Children—Is En Route to Ellis Island for Embarkment to Germany

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 20.—Walter Baer, 36-year old engineer and active worker among the unemployed, is en route to Ellis Island on a deportation train on an order by the U. S. Labor Department for his deportation to Nazi Germany, a country he never knew and whose language he does not speak.
