New Constitution of the Soviet Union Is Approved

Two Houses Of Deputies To Be Elected

Document Consists of Thirteen Sections With 148 Articles

By Sender Garlin (Special to the Daily Worker) MOSCOW, June 11 (By Cable)—A milestone in the history of the entire world was marked tonight with the publication of the new draft of the new Constitution of the Soviet Union.

The document opens with the historic declaration: "The political basis of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics is formed by Soviets of Toilers' Deputies which grew up and were consolidated as a result of the overthrow of the rule of landowners and capitalists and the achievement of the dictatorship of the proletariat; all power in the Soviet Union resides in the willers of town and country in the form of Soviets of toilers' Deputies."

Wrangle Over Platform Prompts Recess of Republican Convention

By Marguerite Young (Special to the Daily Worker) CLEVELAND, Ohio, June 11.—The thousand and two delegates to the Republican National Convention, like some 1,000 visitors who are officially recognized as mere spectators, twiddled their thumbs and waited for the formality of nominating Alfred Mossman Landon today while 48 persons, representative mainly of the owners of America, finished up the platform on which the candidate will run.

Chief points of interest in the draft platform were the labor plank on the minimum wage, which is so intimately linked to the Supreme Court veto question and the money standard plank, which involves the conflicting desires not only of middle-class western farmers and spokesmen such as Senator William E. Borah with his liking for inflationary measures, but also the conflict between financial camps themselves, who disagree on whether and, if so, how and when to return to the gold standard.

He showed that the "non-partisanship" of the reactionary executive council is partisanship with the worst enemies of the workers—those forces which stand bluntly and boldly for the crushing of the trade union movement.

IT IS little less than a year ago, also, that Green joined in a "non-partisan" declaration, signed up by William Randolph Hearst, against "crime and Communism." On Tuesday he reiterated openly "the policies of the man at San Simon."
