

Ridder's Order On Alliance Is Protested

Limiting of Conferences Scored in Statement to Williams
The Workers' Alliance of Greater New York yesterday protested to Aubrey Williams, deputy administrator of WPA, against an order issued by Victor F. Ridder, New York City WPA administrator, limiting appointments with the organization's grievance committee to once a month.

It is indeed strange, said Miss Pearlman, "that the administration should take such a position just one short week after Williams' assurance that the Workers' Alliance would be recognized as the collective bargaining agency of WPA workers. What are our members to do during this month," she asked, "if we cannot and will not comply with such an order, but we all mean as our command to fight it."

True American Described by Kent in New Masses

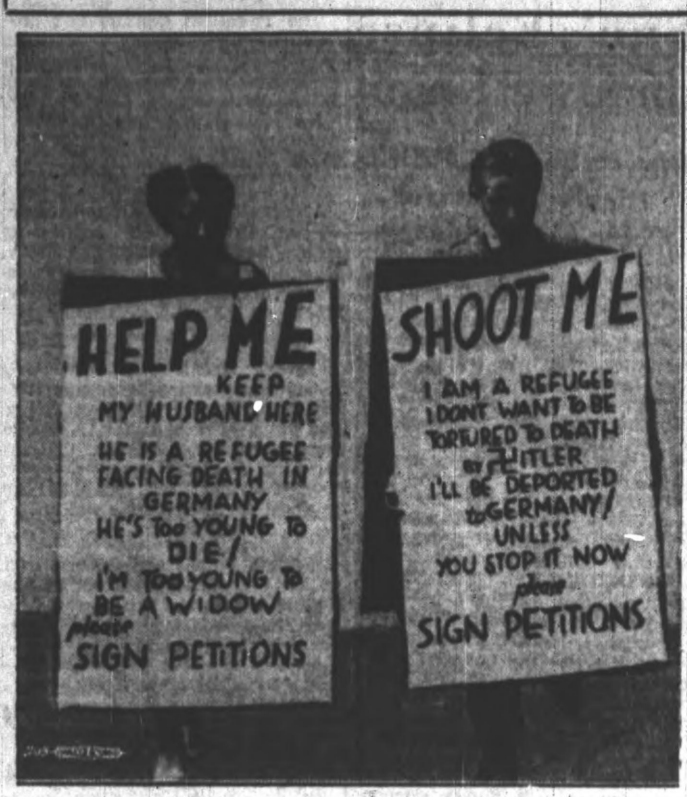

Finding himself named as "an un-American citizen" in a blacklist published by the Daughters of the American Revolution, Kent brands the authors of this blacklist as "rampant Nordic Nitwits." Many of his ancestors, declares Kent, "were among the earliest settlers of America and served with valor in the War of Independence."

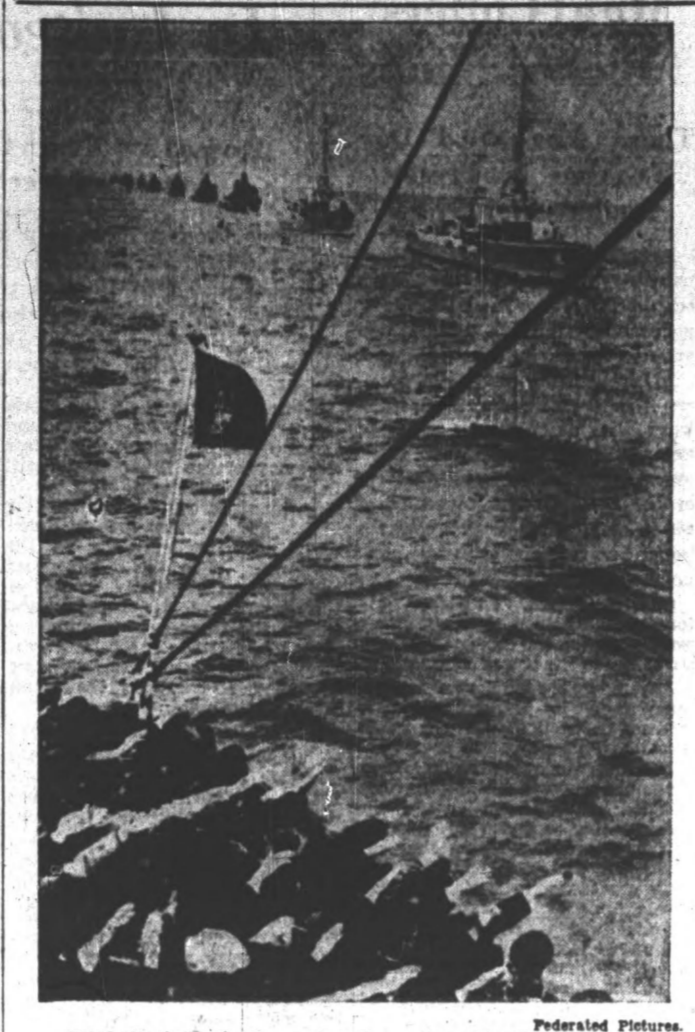
