A great deal of useful destruction has been accomplished. Now it is necessary to construct. Here are three questions: To construct what? To construct where? To construct how?

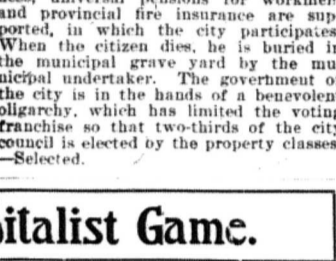
The new time brings new duties.
