ROME, Italy.—The executive of the Socialist party of Italy has decided not to authorize the casting of ballots at the approaching elections for candidates of other parties (in localities where there is no Socialist candidate) unless they declare their disapproval of the imperialistic attack upon Libya and unless they pledge themselves to the support of the party's military purposes.
