Mysterious Corporation to Battle with Ryan.

Albany-Attorneys Refuse Name of lectors-Traction Trust Con -Application for Fran chise to Be Made to Public Service Commission - To Operate Lowe Crosstown Line First.

Wrapping the names of its direc torate and officials in secrecy, an apparently well-financed corporation is about to fight Thomas F. D. Ryan and the Traction Trust for possession of a three-cent fare.

None of the officials who have aided Thomas Fortune Ryan in his street railroad manipulations would believe last night that the new company would actually begin operations. It is called the Greater New York Traction Company, and its articles of fares" formed a preminent feature, were filed with the Secretary of State in Albany yesterday.

The articles set forth that the purpose of the company is to build and the Brooklyn Bridge, Fulton street, Cortlandt and Barclay street ferries and affording a lower crosstown ser

The articles further state that the purpose of the company is to construct, own, maintain and operate electric surface street railway carr on other streets, avenues and public places in the city or New York for a three cent fare.




