Beethoven Program Magnet For Music-Loving Crowds

Carnegie Hall Besieged by Vast Throng Seeking Admission to People's Symphony Concert.

Full evidence of the fact that the music of the archmaster, Ludwig van Beethoven, is not only appreciated, but actually loved by the cosmopolitan resident population of New York city, was afforded in the size, as well as the genuine enthusiasm, of last night's audience in Carnegie Music Hall, where the third of the People's Symphony Concerts for the current season was given under the leadership of Franz X. Arens.

A double attraction was held for the vast crowd of music lovers, of every race and nationality, in the performance by the orchestra of the second and third movements of the Ninth symphony, the master creation of Beethoven, and in the delivery of the solo role in the "Emperor" concerto for pianoforte, in E-flat, by Heinrich Gebhard, the Boston virtuoso, with the support of the band. The evening's program consisted wholly of instrumental works of the immortal composer and, in addition to the symphony movements and the concerto, presented the orchestral Polonaise (opus 8), and the "Turkish March" from "The Ruin of Athens."

HARLEM WANTS CASSIDY FOR S. P. ORGANIZER

No soloist relieved the slightly academic array of concert music, but the four ensemble offerings held the attention of the large and representative audience and each was spiritedly received.
