## STATE HIGHWAY BILL PASSED YESTERDAY

ALBANY, April 27.—The Tomblin bill providing for a State highway from New York to Rouse's Point passed the Assembly today. The bill carries with it an appropriation of \$1,000,000 and provides that where any county receives more than its allotment of road improvements the State Highway Commission shall complete such roads as it deems necessary.
