WAIST MAKERS WIN IMPORTANT VICTORY. Two City Firms Grant Demand of Union—Shop Strikes Called in Several Plants.

One of the greatest victories won by the Ladies' Waist and Dress Makers' Union, Local 25, in the past three years was scored yesterday when the National Waist Company, 37 West 20th street, employing about 300 men and women, granted the demands of its workers and signed an agreement with the union. The employees of the company were out on strike for three days as a result of the company's refusal to deal with the union, the Italian workers having been instrumental in the calling of the strike.
