Chairman Mao made profound and wise theses on the policy, system, and line of the proletarian educational revolution and on the revolutionization of teaching materials and teaching methods. Some schools have embarked on the experiment of letting students give lectures. This method is worth recommending.

Teachers must be brave enough to go to the classrooms. Revolutionary teachers and cadres must be brave enough to take responsibility and pave the way for others. Some comrades have many misgivings. Fear must be removed.

A thoroughgoing materialist is a fearless man. The revolutionary cadres and teachers should be aware of their responsibility and strive to win fresh merits in the educational revolution.

The revolutionary Red Guard young fighters are the main force in the educational revolution. It is an extremely arduous and glorious task to repudiate the bourgeois educational system and establish a proletarian system. You are playing a leading role on this battlefield.
