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[PEOPLE'S DAILY Commentator's 22 March article: "Revolutionary mass criticism and repudiation should not be relaxed, not even for a moment"]

[Text] There are two entirely different attitudes toward the revolutionary mass criticism and repudiction.

One of the attitudes is: to pose the campaign of revolutionary mass criticism and repudiation against other wasks, to wage it by fits and starts, and to think that it really makes no difference whether there is such a campaign or not. If such an attitude prevails, it will be impossible for us to carry it on; furthermore, we will not be able to do well in other tasks.

The other attitude is: to regard the revolutionary mass criticism and repudiation as the general orientation for struggle during the great proletarian cultural revolution, to link this campaign with other tasks, and to promote other works through this campaign of revolutionary mass criticism and repudiation.

The basic content of the great proletarian cultural revolution is always the campaign of revolutionary mass criticism and repudiation. Looking back on the history of the great proletarian cultural revolution, can we find any progress, or any victory, which can be separated from the revolutionary mass criticism and repudiation? Is tak the campaign of revolutionary mass criticism and repudiation that kindled the blazing fire of the great proletarian cultural revolution and it was this campaign that shaped the public opinion for the unprecedented great revolution. It was this campaign that ripped off the mask of the bourgeois reactionary line, exposed the true features of the handful of top capitalist-roaders in the party and their agents, and provided the necessary conditions for the proletariat to seize power.
