## CENTRAL COMMITTEE'S HOMAGE

[**COMRADE SHIBDAS GHOSH**, the leader, teacher, guide and the General Secretary of our Party, the **SOCIALIST UNITY CENTRE OF INDIA** breathed his last of acute Myocardial Infarction (severe and massive heart attack) at 7-30 P.M. on Thursday the 5th August, 1976 at the Party's Central Commune in Calcutta at the age of 55.

Immediately after HIS sudden and premature demise the Central Committee took the following resolution paying homage in memory of the great departed leader.]

The Central Committee of our Party expresses its profound and deepest grief at the sudden and premature demise of **COMRADE SHIBDAS GHOSH** our beloved leader, teacher, guide and the General Secretary of our Party, the **SOCIALIST UNITY CENTRE OF INDIA**. He was one of the outstanding Marxist thinkers of the present era. It was **COMRADE SHIBDAS GHOSH** who concretised Marxism-Leninism on Indian soil, developed, elaborated and enriched many aspects of it and also brought many other aspects to a new height at this particular stage of the present era of 'Imperialism and Proletarian Revolution' enunciated by Lenin. HE also provided a newer and concrete understanding of Marxism-Leninism in course of dealing with the problems that appeared not only in the political and socio-economic fields, but also covering all aspects of life and epistemology—science and philosophy, ethics, morality, culture, art-literature and aesthetics in the post-Lenin period. So, it is incumbent on all to make a serious cult of the thoughts of **COMRADE SHIBDAS GHOSH** without which the understanding of Marxism-Leninism at this stage of the present era cannot be adequate.

## HOW THE END CAME

5th of August 1976 will be marked in the history of the revolutionary working class struggle not only of our country but of the entire world as well as a day of profound loss and grief. One of the finest of revolutionary brains—the brain of a giant Marxist philosopher and thinker of the age that was guiding so long to build, brick by brick, braving all odds and amidst mountain-high obstacles set in the path, by reactionaries of all hue and all varieties of reformism-revisionism social-democratism, the solid edifice of a genuine revolutionary working class party on our soil, the Socialist Unity Centre of India, ceased to operate.

The great genius that in this very process of building up a revolutionary party, while so long, was zealously guarding and defending the revolutionary Kernel of Marxism, in the post-Lenin period, against all sorts of onslaughts from revisionism-reformism that has appeared as 'a main danger in the international communist movement and in doing so, developed Marxism further and elevated it to a higher stage, the great revolutionary leader of the age whose versatile revolutionary wisdom which was defending revolutionary achievements of the international proletarian movement and the essence of their success against the slanderers and was showing as well with unmistakable precision, the pitfalls and short-comings that are to be guarded against in the great cause of advancement of world revolution, passed away so suddenly.

Comrade Shibdas Ghosh our most beloved leader, teacher, guide and the General Secretary of our party—the Socialist Unity Centre of India, an outstanding Marxist philosopher and thinker of the era, breathed his last at 7-30 P.M. on 5th of August, prematurely at the age of 55 and so suddenly of Myocardial Infarction (Massive and severe Heart-attack).

He was a patient of Hypertension. From the middle of July, pressure was alarmingly high. After undergoing medical treatment for about ten days, his blood pressure came down and showed sign of stability. Meanwhile he developed acidity and gastric complaints which seemed to have subsided on 4th of August. He was free from those troubles and had a good sleep on that night. He woke up quite hale and hearty and talked with the comrades in the Commune as usual and with freeness. He then went for wash and came back to his room for breakfast. It was then 8-30 in the morning and at that moment he suffered the massive heart-attack, all on a sudden. Immediately, a local Physician Dr. B. Sarkar was called to give instant medical care and attention. Dr. N. Guha an eminent Heart Specialist and under whose treatment, Comrade Ghosh had been for long, was contacted. Dr. Guha came within a short time and took the entire charge of his treatment. Dr. Anupam Dasgupta, an eminent Neuro-Physician under whose treatment

Comrade Ghosh was during his attack from Guillain-Barre Syndrome following Chicken Pox in 1972 and Dr. Buxi, an eminent Heart Specialist and the Chief Cardiologist of Belle Vue Nursing Home were called for consultation. Besides, Dr. T.K. Burman, Dr. Sarkar, Dr. Dipak Banerjee also attended him. With exemplary nerves, our great leader was fighting the massive and successive heart attacks and continued the fight for eleven hours till at last he breathed his last, plunging the class, the Party and the masses in profound grief and sorrow.

Besides the two C. C. members—Com. Nihar Mukherjee, and Com. Sachin Banerjee, Comrades Robi Bose, Ranjit Dhar, Manik Mukherjee—all members of the W. B. State Secretariat, Com. Protiva Mukherjee, Fatick Ghosh and other members of the Commune were also present. The other State and District leaders who rushed on hearing the first news of Comrade Ghosh's heart attack were Comrades, Ashutosh Banerjee, Anil Sen, Sukomal Dasgupta, Provash Ghosh, Moni Chatterjee, Ajit Sen, Sanat Dutta, Gayatri Dasgupta, among others. They were all along there and at his bed-side when he breathed his last. Even in this critical stage of his health, our beloved leader was full of nerves and was enquiring of the Comrades around, about the convenience of the doctors and the drivers.

Our beloved leader was not pulling well for a long time. His ceaseless activities and the tortuous battles he had to wage, for long, amidst extremely trying situations during the freedom movement and early stages of our Party, told badly on his health. What was always supreme in his mind was how to build up the proletarian party on our soil and uphold the cause of World Revolution. For about 42 years he had been in the thick of political activities and the greater part of it was entirely devoted to the historic task he took upon himself. He braved cerebral attacks twice. Just four years back, an attack of the said disease (Guillain-Barre Syndrome) was so virulent that it paralysed his entire body minus the central nervous system. He was on the verge of death. But like in all other fields, he displayed exemplary courage and fighting stamina, steeled nerves and cool calmness in fighting out the disease which made possible the recovery within a time far less than what was expected by the eminent doctors.

After his recovery he was again in his usual self of untiring activities. Doctors were urging him not to cause any strain on his health. But revolutionary politics was his very life-breath. The agony for the exploited masses—how quickly to organise revolution to bring an end to exploitation of all sorts and to place humanity on to the road of all-round progress, how best the

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comrades are engaging themselves, body and soul, in this noble task as well as the achievement and set backs in world proletarian movement were all that filled his mind so fully that rest in the usual sense of the term had no meaning for him. "I exist as a revolutionary so long I breathe"—was not merely what he would tell the comrades but his life was the burning example of this noble teaching. And from this impersonal approach to ailments, he never lost the composure, never was there any absence of the serenity of mind reflected on his face, even minute before he breathed his last. When the doctors were trying to console him, with smile on his lips, he consoled them, saying—"I am calm—not anxious", struggling at the same time with rare nerves, the unbearing pain that he was suffering. Such was the metal in which was moulded the Great Revolutionary Leader of the age and at whose loss, the world is surely very much poorer to-day.

Equally impersonal was his attitude to success and failure in struggles. Any success, any achievement of the party and of the comrades brought great joy and satisfaction to him only in so far as it meant inching towards revolutionary goal and objective. And so even in the midst of success and achievement he was found deeply absorbed in thinking and would teach the comrades not to be complacent, but modest, guard the achievements and think of the newer problems and complexities as also of the heavier responsibilities attended with success and achievements.

His was a most living link with the comrades and the common people. For the ordinary people and party workers he had greater sympathy and attention even in their day to day problems. He lived althrough in Party-Commune along with comrades, some of whom were In-charges of local units of the party. For the common people and party workers he was always accessible and a constant source of inspiration, love, sympathy and affection. At the Central Office of the party he would attend the urgent works but would dispose them of as quickly as possible because his concern for the comrades was far greater. He devoted more time and attention to train them up as steeled revolu-

tionaries. He would sit with them and spend hours together, discussing, explaining and teaching them on all aspects of the life of a revolutionary and his method was always to draw the comrades in discussions and debates. So what animation, what a spirit of inspiration would prevail in those discussions! Equally for the young and aged, those discussions were always educative and with what eagerness they would stand around him to hear and take part in those!

Is it difficult then, to imagine with what great shock and anxiety the comrades heard the news of the critical condition of their most beloved leader and teacher? Anxious queries about his health condition were pouring in the Central Office from all corners of the country throughout the day. Hundreds of comrades who came rushing either to Party's Central Office or Central Commune and were waiting with bated breath reached the end of their reserves on hearing the heart-rending news. But comrades were alerted that we were to prove ourselves the worthy standard-bearers of our Great Teacher and Leader who taught us never to allow our deep emotions and feelings to run high over our sense of duties as in us, in our party alone, is the only ray of hope for the class and the masses for their emancipation. So, how can we afford to forget our noble obligations, our duties, even in the midst of our deepest grief!

Wiping the tears rolling down their cheeks, controlling with supreme efforts, comrades recovered their composure to prepare for the Last Journey of our Beloved Leader, for a befitting farewell to the Great Revolutionary—the pride of any soil.

The body of Comrade Ghosh brought to the Party's Central Office at Zero hour, escorted by our leaders and received by hundreds of comrades with 'Guard of Honour', was placed at the raised platform in the Central hall, draped with Party Flags and bedecked with white flowers. Volunteers with lowered half-mast Red Flags stood on guard in their night long vigil. The Flag flew half-mast. Deepest of sorrows frozen in calmness, leaders and party comrades all absorbed in their duties—this was the night of 5th August.

It was the dawn of 6th August. With the break of light Party's Central Office and around were filled up with streaming party workers, supporters, sympathisers and cross sections of the toiling people. Stunned with blow so cruel, they were mute. It was simply unbelievable! How could it be? Tears raining down their eyes, sobbing, they were gently coming up-stairs to see the Great Commandar who was the tower of strength in all their complex battles, and ever-flowing fountain of inspiration in all their weal and woe and ever-patient in his ears and attention with unbound love and affection to the minutest details of their problems in personal life. Yes, it was the face that would lit up in the glow of radiating wisdom whenever there was a particular problem broached to him—anything to wit, from the vast range of epistemology, the eyes that had so fine a glow of smile whenever the comrades achieved something—be it a correct understanding or in their battles—the same face but what a difference! No—they will treasure in their memories, the face that was so ennobling, so very inspiring, they will still hear the voice—the voice of an indomitable will, the voice of an indefatigable determination that will continue to remind them of their great task and many many miles to go to bring that cherished goal to reality. Such memories and the vast reservoir of knowledge and guidance bequethed to them by their Great Leader and Teacher would serve as the living guide to all of their activities. He is and will be living in the finest of his creations—the Party and would live in every achievement, in every advancement, in every step forward in all aspects of life of the comrades and of the party.

Workers, poor peasants, agricultural labourers, employees, students, youths, teachers and educationists, social workers, doctors, lawyers, journalists, veteran freedom fighters, political leaders and workers—people from every walk of life,

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# Hold Aloft The Banner Of Revolution Handed Down To Us By Our Great Leader Comrade Shibdas Ghosh!

Its kernel, the living soul of this noblest revolutionary ideal also is ingrained in its cultural and moral values".

He taught us repeatedly that man is the product of history, of a definite historic process. He also taught us that honesty, dedication or sacrifice, all these are essential, rather indispensable for becoming a revolutionary. He nodded and with tears and emotion-choked voice asked the Comrades to see that his creation is not lost. "No Never—we will keep His Flag flying" was the firm assurance of the Comrades. These are just a few specimens to quote. The deep anguish and agony of the people are still finding expressions in their telegrams and letters that are pouring in hundreds continuously. This again shows how correct was the observation of our Great Leader who often reminded us: for us, for the Party, there is a vast and inexhaustible fund of goodwill, love and admiration amongst the toiling millions of our country which has fed and nourished the Party to grow. "Politics demands higher emotional faculty. Much higher and nobler is demanded in revolutionary politics. As tender feelings and emotions are there, so also inherent in it stark reality, iron, discipline and unfailing sense of responsibility. Grief cannot overpower our sense of duties. So rude is the outward appearance of revolutionary politics. But true realisation of grief lies exactly in what appears to be so rude outwardly. Even in the deepest of grief no great revolutionary fails to carry on his duty. Work they must. Nothing can muddle the question of their work. Then they cannot aspire to be revolutionaries, they are to lead the life of a common man.

"This is why, I was saying, revolutionary politics is a higher and nobler emotional faculty. But outwardly its working style seems to be heartless. Apparently it seems to be devoid of finer feelings and emotions, bereft of compassion and sympathy—as if a machine. But the reality is quite otherwise. The finer feeling of a revolutionary finds its real recognition in his devotion to duty. The pain and anguish of the whole society as also the values of life have left so deep an imprint in the minds of the revolutionaries that it impells them to take the firm resolve of giving concrete shape to the task of emancipation of the people. For this, the revolutionaries never neglect their duties. Even at the time of death of a near and dear one, even at the hour of a great loss, or at the height of their emotional turmoil—the revolutionaries can hardly forget their duties.....

".....Mere expression of grief, mere emotional outburst carries no meaning to the revolutionaries if they do not realise the real significance of the cause of grief that has pained them so much and what it really demands of them to perform in their life. Remember, even when a man is deeply shocked to find something grievously harmful in the society, its real meaning comes to his realisation only when from this he can find the way out—how to free the society from its evil effect, for that what is he to do and realising this he never neglects his duties."
